Jr. Fair Dairy feeder Steer Show: Class J-511 - 4:00 PM on Monday, August 12, 2024

Rules

June 1st Deadline for Entries

- All dairy steers must be identified, on feed, and in the member's immediate possession and daily care by June 1st.
- Each Junior Fair exhibitor may enter four (4) Dairy Beef Feeder Steers but may show a maximum of three (3) Dairy Steers.
- All market animals must be dehorned.
- All market dairy feeder steers will weigh-in on June 15, 2024. If you cannot make this time, please contact Terry Bennet to make alternate arrangements.
- Attention: Per the rules set forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture, to exhibit and/or participate in the livestock sale at the Miami County Fair, Jr. Fair Exhibitors of Market Steers must have completed a Quality Assurance Program.
- Steers will be shown by weight classes. Class listings will be posted in the steer barn as to the breakdown of the show.
- Minimum weight for dairy feeder steers is 300 pounds maximum weight is 700 pounds. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
- Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the fair will be issued a \$4 payment voucher for every head of cattle they show. The voucher must be redeemed at the Secretary's Office before Friday, August 16, 2024 at 5:00 pm.

<u>Jr. Fair Dairy Market Steer Show: Class J-510</u> - Monday, August 12, 2024 following the Dairy Feeder Calf Show Rules

- All market animals must be dehorned.
- All market steers will weigh in January or February, a time to be announced by the Senior Fairboard. Check with your Club Advisor.
- Attention: Per the rules set forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture, to exhibit and/or participate in the livestock sale at the Miami County Fair, Jr. Fair Exhibitors of Market Steers must have completed a Quality Assurance Program.
- Steers will be shown by weight classes. Class listings will be posted in the steer barn as to the breakdown of the show.
- All steers must have been owned and in exhibitors care by January 1, 2024

- Entries limited to three (3) market animals, one or two of which must be heifers. You may enter up to 4 head total.
- Minimum weight for steers is 900 lbs. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
- Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the fair will be issued a \$4 payment voucher for every head of cattle they show. The voucher must be redeemed at the Secretary's Office before Friday, August 16, 2024 at 5:00 pm.

<u>Jr. Fair Beef Feeder Calf Show: Class J-513</u> - Monday, August 12, 2024 following the Born & Raised Calf Show Rules

- Each Junior Fair exhibitor may enter four (4) beef feeders but may show a maximum of three beef feeders.
- Side photos of the animal & project entry form must also be delivered to the drop off box at the fair Secretary's office on or before June 1 of the current year.
- Calves must be sired by a beef bull and out of a good grade beef cow. No dairy breeding accepted.
- Heifers and steers must be born after January 1, 2024 and before June 1, 2024, and weigh between 300 and 700 pounds. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
- Calves must be castrated. Dehorning is recommended, but not necessary.
- Calves must be broken to lead and show.
- Steers and Heifers will show in the same classes unless numbers warrant otherwise.
- Classes will be determined at fair time depending on weight and number of calves available.
- Beef feeders will have the option of selling in the Junior Fair Livestock Sale.
- All beef feeders will be stalled together in an area designated by the superintendents.
- Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the fair will be issued a \$4 payment voucher for every head of cattle they show. The voucher must be redeemed at the Secretary's Office before Friday, August 16, 2024 at 5:00 pm.

<u>Jr. Fair Beef Breeding Show: Class J-501</u> - Monday, August 12, 2024 following the Beef Feeder Calf Show Rules

- All breeding animals must have been owned and in the exhibitor's care by June 1 of the current year.
- Online Entry will be taken from April 1 through June 1, 2024
- Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the fair will be issued a \$4 payment voucher for every head of cattle they show. The voucher must be redeemed at the Secretary's Office before Friday, August 16, 2024 at 5:00 pm.

- All market steers and heifers will weigh in January or February, a time to be announced by the Senior Fairboard. Check with your

Club Advisor.

- Attention: Per the rules set forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture, to exhibit and/or participate in the livestock sale, at the Miami County Fair, Junior Fair Exhibitors of Market Steers must have completed a Quality Assurance Program.
- Steers will be shown by weight classes. Class listings will be posted in the steer barn as to the breakdown of the show.
- Each exhibitor will be permitted to sell only one market animal through the sale ring.
- All steers must have been owned and in the exhibitor's care by January 1, 2024.
- Entries limited to three (3) market animals, one or two of which must be heifers. You may enter up to 4 heads in total.
- Minimum weight for steers is 900 lbs. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
- Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the fair will be issued a \$4 payment voucher for every head of cattle they show. The voucher must be redeemed at the Secretary's Office before Friday, August 16, 2024 at 5:00 pm.

Open Dairy Beef Feeder Show - 4:00 PM Saturday, August 10, 2024

Rules

- Entry fees are \$20/head in county \$30 out of county
- Entries due at time of weigh-in. No early entries!
- See show office for show order.
- Dairy Feeders must be of dairy breeds or a dairy-on-dairy cross. No beef breed crosses. Cross breeds must be named breeds.
- All dairy steers must be dehorned and smooth-healed.
- Classes for dairy beef feeder steers will be determined at fair time depending on weight and number of calves available.
- A champion and reserve dairy steer will be selected from class winners.
- Dairy steers will be shown as beef.
- Weight limit is 400-700 pounds.
- Limited to three (3) entries per exhibitor.
- Classes prorated

Open Beef Feeder Calf Show - Follows Born & Raised Dairy Beef Feeder Steer Show

Rules

- Entry fees are \$20/head in county, \$30 out of county
- Entries due at time of weigh-in. No early entries!
- All non-Junior Fair animals must be on the grounds by Saturday, August 10, 2024 at 9:00 am.
- Any non-Junior Calves released immediately following Open Steer Show.
- Calves must be sired by a beef bull and out of a good grade beef cow. No dairy breeding accepted.
- Heifers and Steers must be born after January 1, 2024, and weigh between 300 and 700 pounds.
- Calves must be castrated. Dehorning is recommended, but not necessary.
- Calves must be broken to lead and show.
- Heifers will be shown in separate classes from steers.
- Classes will be determined by weight. Heifers will show first.
- All participants must abide by the show rules as set forth by the State of Ohio.

Prize money will be prorated:

- ★ Champion Steer \$200 Reserve Champion Steer \$150
- ★ Champion Heifer \$200 Reserve Champion Heifer \$150

<u>Paint Open Steer Show</u> (paint below knee of hock ONLY)- Follows Born & Raised Dairy Beef Feeder Steer Show Rules

- Entry fees are \$20/head. *Out of County Entry Fee = \$40/head.
- Entries due at time of weigh-in. No early entries!
- All animals must be on the grounds by Saturday, August 10, 2024 at 9:00 am.
- Open to anyone.
- Steers must be halter broke.
- Limited to five (5) entries per exhibitor.
- Cattle will be weighed to determine the class in which they will show by weight.
- The same animal will be allowed in both the Open Class show and the Jr. Fair show.
- Open class steers WILL NOT sell.
- Minimum weight for steers 900 lbs.
- All participants must abide by the show rules as set forth by the State of Ohio.
- Open Class Steers released immediately after the show.

Prize money will be prorated:

Open Class Beef Breeding Show - 2pm on Sunday, August 11, 2024

Rules

- Entry fees are \$20/head in county, \$40 out of county
- Entries will be taken at the Show Office @ 9:30 AM. Will except early entries.
- Superintendents make all stall assignments and no stalls will be assigned until the entry fee is paid.
- All animals except steers must be registered in the exhibitor's name. (Papers/ztattoo checks)
- If certificates are requested by department Superintendent or Judges, the exhibitor must produce them.
- All beef cattle must pass state health standards. Out of state must show health papers.
- Premiums: All prorated by number of entries per class will pay placings 1st and 2nd
- All animals must be in the ring within five minutes after the first call.
- Cattle not kept in assigned space will not be eligible to show. The exhibitors must keep stalls and aisles clean.
- Grooming chutes used in designated areas only.
- All Open Class exhibitors released Sunday immediately following the Show.
- All fans must be at least 48" from the ground
- NOTE: Classes 501 through 505 are registered purebred classes. Will need to bring registration papers.
- Shown by breeds even if 1 per breed.
