- All dairy steers must be identified, on feed, and in the member's immediate possession and daily care by June 1st.
- Each Junior Fair exhibitor may enter four dairy beef feeder steers but may show a maximum of three dairy steers.
- All market animals must be dehorned.
- All market dairy feeder steers will weigh in June or July, a time to be announced by the Senior Fairboard. Check with your Club Advisor.
- Attention: Per the rules set forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture. To exhibit and/or participate in the Market Animal Exhibitor Premium Auction at The Miami County Fair, Junior Fair Exhibitors of Market Steers must have completed a Quality Assurance Program.
- Steers will be shown by weight classes. Class listings will be posted in the steer barn as to the breakdown of the show.
- All steers must have been owned and in exhibitors care by June 1, 2022
- Minimum weight for dairy feeder steers is 300 pounds maximum weight is 700 pounds. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
- Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the fair will be issued a payment voucher. The voucher should be taken to the Sr. Fair Office before Friday at 5:00 pm to be redeemed.

- **Order of Weigh In: Market steers and Heifers, Beef Feeder Calves, Dairy Beef Feeders and Junior Fair Beef Breeding Check in will follow.**

Each Junior Fair exhibitor may enter four beef feeders but may show a maximum of three beef feeders.

1. Side photos of the animal & project entry form must also be delivered to the drop off box at the fair Secretary's office on or before June 1 of the current year.
2. Calves must be sired by a beef bull and out of a good grade beef cow. No dairy breeding accepted.
3. Heifers and steers must be born after January 1, 2022 and before June 1, 2022, and weigh between 300 and 700 pounds. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
4. Calves must be castrated. Dehorning is recommended, but not necessary.
5. Calves must be broken to lead and show.
6. Steers and Heifers will show in the same classes unless numbers warrant otherwise.
7. Classes will be determined at fair time depending on weight and number of calves available.
8. Beef feeders will have the option of selling in the Junior Fair Livestock Sale.
9. All beef feeders will be stalled together in an area designated by the superintendents.
10. Junior Fair Participants who are exhibitors at the Fair will be issued a payment voucher.

The voucher should be taken to the Sr. Fair office by Friday at 5:00 p.m. to be redeemed.

- Attention: Per the rules set forth by the Ohio Department of Agriculture. To exhibit and/or participate in the livestock sale, at The Miami County Fair, Junior Fair Exhibitors of Market Steers must have completed a Quality Assurance Program.
- Steers will be shown by weight classes. Class listings will be posted in the steer barn as to the breakdown of the show.
- Each exhibitor will be permitted to sell only one market animal through the sale ring. Market steers/heifers sold through the Junior Fair Livestock Sale becomes the immediate property of the buyer. Buyers decide only to truck or pen.
- **Sale of Champions: All Grand Champion/Reserve Champion market animals will be sold on Wednesday, August 18, 2022 during the LIVE, IN PERSON auction Sale of Champions. .**
- **Animals must be judged at the fair to participate in ANY sale.**
- All steers must have been owned and in exhibitors care by January 1, 2022
- Entries limited to three market animals, one or two of which must be heifers. You may enter up to 4 heads in total.
- Minimum weight for steers is 900 lbs. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.

- A champion and reserve dairy steer will be selected from class winners.
- Dairy steers will be shown as beef
- Weight limit is 400- 700 pounds.
- Limited to three (3) entries per exhibitor.

- Calves must be castrated. Dehorning is recommended, but not necessary.
- Calves must be broken to lead and show.
- Heifers will be shown in separate classes from steers. Classes will be determined by weight. Heifers will show first. All participants must abide by the show rules as set forth by the State of Ohio.

- Superintendents make all stall assignments, and no stall assigned until entry fee is paid.
- All animals except steers must be registered in the exhibitor's name and certificates of its produced if requested by department superintendent or judges.
- All beef cattle must pass state health standards'
- Premium - All prorated by number of entries per class will pay placings 1st and 2nd
- All animals must be in the ring within five minutes after the first call.
- Cattle not kept in assigned space will not be eligible to show. The exhibitors must keep stalls and aisles clean.
- Grooming chutes used in designated areas only.

- All fans must be at least 48" from the ground

Entry Fee: \$15.00 per head Pre-Entry is welcome with final entry at the scales at time of weigh in. Beef breeding entries will be taken at the show office @ 9:30 a.m. See show office for show order.

PAY OUT TO BE DETERMINED DAY OF SHOW

- All animals must be on the grounds by Thursday 8/12/2022 10:00 p.m.
- Weigh-in 8:30 to 9:30 am Saturday.
- All breeding animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name and certificates of registration available if requested by the show superintendent or judges.
- All dairy market animals must be steers
- All beef cattle must pass state health standards including open class steers.
- Premiums/Awards: Any premium award will be prorated by number of entries per class. Born and Raised classes will place the top five (5) places.
- All animals are to be in the ring within five (5) minutes after the first call of the class.
- Cattle not kept in assigned space will not be eligible to show.
- The exhibitors must keep stalls and aisles clean.
