Location: Goat/Cattle Show Arena- The Sale of Champions will take place on Thursday August 18th at 9:00 a.m. and will be followed by the Live Market Animal Exhibitor Premium Auction. When the time comes for Market Barrow Exhibitor Premium Auction there will be a short intermission/break and the auction will move to the Swine Show Arena for the conclusion of the auction.

- **ALL JUNIOR FAIR ANIMAL EXHIBITORS SHOWING DURING THE 2022 MIAMI COUNTY FAIR MAY BE ENTERED IN THE ONLINE ADD-ON SALE THAT BEGINS August 19, 2022. This includes breeding stock, horses and dogs. During Online Entry creation exhibitors will need to enter the On-Line Add On found as a Department to be included.**

2022 Release of animal Information:

IF not going through the Market Animal Exhibitor Premium Auction on Thursday August 18th, **ALL** 4-H or FFA animals will be released on Wednesday, August 17th at the close of fair (11:00 pm) -7:00 am Thursday. Those who choose to stay Thursday and those taking part in the MARKET ANIMAL EXHIBITOR PREMIUM LIVE AUCTION are required to remain on the grounds until the sale of said species is completed. - **EACH 10X10 TENT SPACE WILL REQUIRE REGISTRATION WITH A FEE OF \$35.00 PER SPACE. Any money collected from this will be used for barn improvements.**
- **FIRST COME FIRST SERVE ON THIS MORNING. JULY 23rd 2022**
- **ONE TENT SPACE PER FAMILY. EACH FAMILY IS RESPONSIBLE FOR REGISTERING THEIR OWN SPACE.**

All barrow exhibitors will be responsible for the removal of their barrows following the fair. Exhibitors are encouraged to make arrangements for slaughter of, or sale to a slaughter channel for their project. All barrows will remain the property of the exhibitor.

Class J-604 Single Barrow

1. **Judging Tuesday August 16th 3:00 p.m. Exhibitor Award \$3.00**
2. Weight limits 220-290 lbs. Exhibitors of underweight and/or overweight market animals are not eligible to go through the live premium auction, but those exhibitors are still included in the online add-ons.
 - a. **New for 2022:** IF THE BARROW IS OVER OR UNDER THE WEIGHT LIMITS LISTED ABOVE, YOU WILL BE ABLE TO SHOW IN THOSE PRE-DETERMINED CLASSES BUT... WILL NOT BE ABLE TO TAKE PART IN ANY CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES.
3. Trophies to Grand, Reserve and Division Champions. Ribbons to 1st through 10th place in each class.
4. Each exhibitor is allowed six (6) barrow entries but can only bring four (4) barrows with one of those barrows being a purebred.
5. Family/household animals may only be shown during the fair by one (1) family exhibitor with that entry listed.
6. All entries must be barrows (crypt orchids will be disqualified from show and sale).
7. All barrows must have been owned by and in the primary care of the exhibitor by June 1 of the current year.
8. All barrows must have received ear notches with the universal ear notching system used by the National Swine Registry by June 1.
9. All barrows must be entered by June 1 of current year on Market Swine entry form.
10. Forms available from April 1st to June 1st.
11. Office hours are Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
12. Entry must provide headshot and both side profiles of hog in photos with ear notches visible/readable.
13. Ear notches on barrows exhibited must match those entered.
14. Failure to match will result in disqualification of said barrow from show and Junior Fair Livestock Sale.
15. Required color photos must be submitted with entry forms.
 - a. Photos are used for identification purposes; photos must match barrows at time of fair.
 - b. Failure to match may result in disqualification.
16. The Barrow Show is a partial-terminal show with the Grand Champion barrow and the Reserve Grand Champion barrow being slaughtered.
17. In a continuing effort to assure quality in the food product to the packers and ultimately the consumer, drug use notification forms will be completed on each market animal exhibited at the Miami County Fair.
 - Each exhibitor must have completed necessary training, applied for and received Pork Quality Assurance Level 3 status prior to June 30th, 2020.
 - Be prepared to provide verification of the Quality Assurance training completion.
 - Follow health rules 901:1-18-102c found in the Junior Fair Book.
 - Water only to be used on market barrows. No oil is permitted.
 - Arrival time for barrows will be: 10:00 p.m. Saturday and no later than 9:00 a.m. Sunday.
 - Exhibitors delivering barrows should enter the fairgrounds at the main gate on County Road 25-A.
 - All livestock trucks and trailers that will be left at the fairgrounds during the fair are to be parked at the far North parking lot along the fence.
 - Barrows must be on the grounds by 9:00 a.m. Sunday. There is a mandatory swine barn meeting at 9:45 a.m. on Sunday.
 - The weighing will start at 10:00 a.m.
 - Barrows must be in their pens during the meeting, as weighing will start promptly.
 - Failure to have hogs in pens will result in those hogs being weighed last and therefore selling last.
 - All animals are to be clean at the time of weigh in.

- All barrows will be weighed one time with that being the official weight.
 - Barrows NOT meeting the weight requirements of 220-290 lbs. will have the opportunity to reweigh one time, within an hour of initial weigh in.
- These weights will determine the class for the show.
- If you don't want your hogs in the same class, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have the weights different by at least 5 lbs.
- Hair on all barrows will be a minimum of one half (½) inch (excluding ears and tails). Any barrow with hair shorter than (½) inch will be disqualified from the show and sale.
- Barrows will be shown in classes by weight and breed. Registration papers will be required to show in purebred classes at the time of weigh in. A minimum of eight (8) barrows will be required to form a purebred class. Division of purebred classes will be at the discretion of the swine committee. All barrows without papers will be shown as crossbreds.
- Number of animals in classes and divisions will be equalized as much as possible at the discretion of the swine committee.
- After the judging, a Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, Third Place, Fourth Place, and Fifth Place will be selected. All breed champions and division champions will compete for Grand Champion Junior Barrow. As the champions are chosen, the reserve in that division will be eligible to compete until the top 5 are chosen.
- Pens, aisles, and adjacent areas are to be cleaned as needed to look presentable to the public always, and animals properly cared for throughout the duration of the fair.
- No pens are to be terminally cleaned until after barrows are loaded to go home.
- No terminal cleaning or moving out of any boxes, supplies, etc. can be conducted during the sale.
- Pens will be cleaned by exhibitors.
- Each exhibitor can sell one (1) market animal through the sale ring.
- The Grand Champion and Reserve Champion barrows are terminal.
- Jr Fair participants who are exhibitors at Jr Fair Show will be issued a payment voucher. These must be redeemed at the Sr Fair Office by Friday at 5:00pm.
- **DRESS CODE** to be adhered at all swine Jr Fair shows: Showman attire: jeans/pants, short or long-sleeved shirts, hard soled shoes. No open toed or open heeled shoes. Shirts must be collared and adequately cover the body, allowing for modesty. Modesty would include, but not limited to, any low cut shirts, tops, etc. that would be considered offensive and that would show cleavage. There shall be no midriff skin visible while showing. Penalty for non-compliance is that the exhibitor will be removed from the show/sale/activity immediately by the Fair Board Member in charge of the department.
- Jr Fair exhibitors must show their own animals. Exceptions will be made only for exhibitors who may be physically impaired, who have two (2) animals entered in the same class or an exhibitor absent on show day due to other commitments. In cases of these exceptions, another boy or girl who is a Miami County Junior Fair livestock exhibitor may exhibit the animal with the authorization of the Superintendent in charge.
- Please be advised to read all Jr Fair rules and regulations.

JR SWINE SHOWMANSHIP- Judging Monday August 15th 11:00 a.m.

- Sign up: Sunday pm or Monday prior to 9:30 a.m.
- Show will begin with the Senior Division and will work in descending order to Junior Division.
- A Jr Fair exhibitor is eligible to show in a showmanship contest with their animal only.
- A Junior, Intermediate, Senior and Showman of Showmen class will be held as noted in each livestock division except for dogs and horses.
- Age for Junior class is 9-11 years of age as of January 1st. Intermediate class is 12-14 years of age as of January 1st. Senior class is 15 years and older as of January 1st. Showman of Showmen includes showmanship division winners for this year and any previous year along with any previous Showman of Showmen.
- Once an age division has been won, you are still eligible to compete in that division until the next age group is reached.

Pen Assignments: Pens will be on a first come first serve basis by bringing your gilt receipt to the swine office on the following dates and times:

- **Saturday, July 23rd, 8am to 12:00pm (NOON)**
- **Thursday, August 11th, 5pm to 9pm**
- **Friday, August 12th, 7am to 10am**

The gilt receipt will be given at the time registration is made. Pre-Registration Entry fees are \$25.00 per head. Pre-registration closes July 23, 2022 at 12:00pm (NOON). Entry forms are available online at www.miamicountyohiofair.com or contact the secretary's office for assistance. Late entries will be accepted until Friday, August 12, 2022 at 10am for a fee of \$30 per head.

Judging... Friday, August 12, 2022 at 4pm. Gilt's are only permitted in this show. Show is open to anyone. Out of state exhibitors must show health papers at check in. There is no limit to the amount of entries. *All gilt's are to be on the grounds by 10am on Friday, August 12, 2022

BARN MEETING... Friday, August 12th at 10:30 am

- All Crossbred gilt's will be weighed at check in.
- All Gilt's must be born after December 1, 2021
- All Breed Gilt's will be shown by age not weight
- Registration papers will be required to show in purebred classes.
 - *Breed Classifications such as color and markings will be determined at the judges discretion. The judge reserves the right to disqualify any animal that does not meet the breed classification.*
 - *Disqualification does not gain you entry into a cross breed competition.*
- Registration papers must be shown at time of check in.
- Division of the purebred class will be at the discretion of the swine committee.
- All gilt's without registration papers will be shown as crossbreds.
- Number of classes and gilt's per class will be determined by total entries and equalized as much as possible at the discretion of the swine committee.
- *A gilt can not be entered as a breed guilt and a crossbred.*
- Exhibitors please note: Pens, aisles, and adjacent areas are to be cleaned daily or as needed and gilt's properly cared for throughout the duration that they are on the grounds.
- PENS MUST BE CLEANED BY EXHIBITORS AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE SHOW.
- VIOLATIONS OF THESE RULES MAY RESULT IN IMMEDIATE FORFEITURE OF PREMIUMS AND AWARDS AS WELL AS BARRING FROM FUTURE COMPETITION.

1. All gilts nominated by members in good standing of the Miami County Swine Breeders Association are eligible for this Miami County Born and Raised Gilt Show
2. The show is open to any exhibitor showing an eligible gilt.
3. Eligible gilts can be brought to the fairgrounds for either the Miami County Born and Raised or the Senior Fair Open Show or both.
4. Nominations
 - a. Will be handled by the Breeder.
 - b. The Breeder must be notified by the exhibitor before June 1st that the gilt needs to be made Miami County Born and Raised eligible and if it is going to be shown as a purebred or a crossbred at the fair.
 - c. Once nominated as purebred it has to be shown as a purebred at the fair. The breeder will do this by turning the exhibitor's name, pig ear notch and pig description to the Miami County Breeder's Association by the June meeting.
 - d. All pigs listed on the Breeders' Born and Raised list will be eligible for the Born and Raised Show. All gilts nominated for the Miami County Born and Raised show must be ear notched and reported in accordance with the "Universal Ear Notching System" used by the National Swine Registry. Ear notches on gilts exhibited must match those nominated. Failure to match will result in disqualification of the gilt from the show and forfeiture of any premiums.
5. Entries will be made in the Swine Barn on Friday, August 14th and are due at 10 am. An entry fee of \$5 will be charged per gilt entered in the Miami County Open Gilt Show. The eligibility of gilts entered will be checked against breeder nomination forms the day of entry prior to the show.
6. **Class Information**
 - a. Gilts will be shown in classes by official weight and by breed.
 - b. Purebred gilts will need to have 4 per breed to make a class otherwise the breeds will be mixed and shown by weight. This will be at the Miami County Swine Breeders' discretion
 - c. Registration papers will be required to show in purebred classes.
 - d. Division of purebred classes will be at the discretion of the show committee.
 - e. There are no weight limits on this show as all gilts will be eligible regardless of weight.
 - f. The official weights taken from the Senior Fair Open Show will be used for this show to divide the classes.
7. **Awards**

 - b. Reserve Champion \$150 and Banner
 - c. 3rd Overall \$100 and Banner
 - d. 4th Overall \$ 75 and Banner

Class 604 Miami County Born and Raised Barrow Show

Show Date: Wednesday, August 17, 2022 Time: 10am

1. The Miami County Born and Raised Barrow show is open to all Miami County Jr. Fair Show exhibitors.
2. The "Breeder" must be a current member of the Miami County Swine Breeders Association.
3. Only Junior Fair barrows will be eligible for this show as no additional barrows will be allowed to be brought to the fairgrounds specifically for this "Born and Raised" show.
4. Nominations
 - a. Will be handled by the breeder. The breeder must be notified by the exhibitor before June 1, 2022 that the barrow needs to be made Miami County Born and Raised eligible and if it is going to be shown as a purebred or as crossbred at the fair.
 - b. Once nominated as a purebred it has to be shown as a purebred at the fair. The breeder will do this by turning in the exhibitor's name, pig ear notch number, and pig description to the Miami County Breeders Association by the June Meeting.
 - c. All pigs listed on the breeders Born and Raised list will be eligible for the Born and Raised Show.
 - d. All barrows nominated for the Miami County Born and Raised Show must be ear notched and reported in accordance with the "Universal Ear Notching System" used by the National Swine Registry. Ear notches on barrows exhibited must match those nominated. Failure to match will result in disqualification of the barrow from the show and forfeiture of any premiums.
5. Entries will be made in the Swine Barn the day of weigh-ins for the Junior Barrow Show. An entry fee of \$5 will be charged per barrow entered in the Miami County Born and Raised Show. Exhibitors are eligible to show both their Junior Fair Barrow in the Born and Raised show provided they both meet the eligibility requirements stated above.
6. Class Information
 - a. Barrows will be shown in classes by weight and by breed.
 - b. Purebred barrows will need to have 4 per breed to make a class otherwise the breeds will be mixed and shown by weight.
 - c. Registration papers will be required to show in purebred classes.
 - d. Division of the pure bred classes will be at the discretion of the show committee.
 - e. There are no weight limits on this show, so all barrows will be eligible to show regardless of weight. The weights taken from the Junior Fair Show will be used for this show to divide the classes. There will be no weigh backs, once you weigh in, that is the weight that will be used.
7. Awards
 - a. Grand Champion \$250 and Banner
 - b. Reserve Champion \$150 and Banner
 - c. 3rd Overall \$100 and Banner
 - d. 4th Overall \$ 75 and Banner
 - e. 5th Overall \$ 50 and Banner
 - f. All Division Champions \$ 25
 - g. All Division Reserves \$ 20
 - h. Class Award... 1st - \$15, 2nd - \$10, 3rd - \$5, 4th - \$5, 5th - \$5, 6th -\$5. Classes could be prorated.
8. Breeders of the Champion and Reserve "Miami County Born and Raised" Barrows will be recognized at the conclusion of the show.
9. Water only is to be used on the skin and hair coat of the barrows.
10. Falsification of information or deliberate attempt to subrogate the above rules shall be grounds for disqualification.
