RULES and REGULATIONS

1. Classes open to students enrolled in Agricultural Education of the current year.
2. The exhibitor must have constructed entries during the current school year.
3. Judges will take into consideration that some of the entries will have been used prior to showing. This will not be counted against the entry.
4. Each article must be labeled with the student's last name, school, and title of entry.
5. Projects must be in place by 6:00 pm on Thursday August 14, 2025 at 7:00 PM.
6. Exhibitors will receive \$2.00 per entry. Achievement Award Ribbons will be presented to all entries.
7. Miami County Agricultural Society will not be responsible for accidents, theft, or damage of projects.
8. Judging will take place Friday, August 8th at 9:00 a.m.
9. Any entry not picked up by August 31, 2025 will become the property of the Miami County Agricultural Society.
